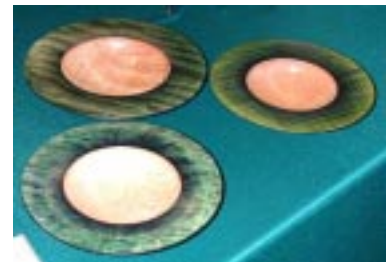

## Take a Turn! Coming in June

Something new and different will be happening at the June meeting of the San Diego Woodturners – everyone is going to “TAKE A TURN”. That’s right, for the first time ever, we are going to have a dozen lathes operating at a meeting and everyone will get to ‘TAKE A TURN’.

If you don’t bring a project, we will have projects from which you can pick. This will be your chance to show off your skills and/or get help from some of your turning colleagues.

The Club’s mentors will be on hand to help you with anything you need. If you are having trouble sharpening a tool, they will help. If you are having trouble making a certain cut, they will help. ## Shop Tours

This article is the first in an occasional series of articles highlighting the shop of one of our members. We will try to show how different people set up their shops: how they store their tools; where they pile their wood; how they accomplish dust extraction; and where they do other work. If you would like to see a particular person's shop, or a certain feature, please let Jim Berger know and he will arrange to get photos to be published in the newsletter.

Since Chuck Luebbers hosted a mentoring session last month, we are taking advantage of Lorin Youde and Tom Cummings notes and photos. This one is less layout and more mentoring notes.

### Shop Tour: A Morning with Chuck Luebbers (Lorin Youde)

I always enjoy visiting the shops of other turners in club. I always walk away with some nuggets of advice. Here are just a few after spending a few hours spent with Chuck.

1. **Clean the lathe's headstock and tailstock Morse tapers**  
Before using a Morse taper clean out the taper with a Taper Mate (green taper cleaner from Craft Supply). Your drives will fit snugly and your tapers will remain undamaged
2. **Clean and lubricate the bed ways of the lathe**  
Chuck uses Bioshield T-9 (also my favorite) on the bed ways after cleaning with a very fine abrasive pad such as a Scotchbright pad or a fine rubberized abrasive block. Your toolrest and tailstock will slide freely.
3. **Lubricate the threads on your headstock before installing chucks/faceplates**  
Use a lubricant such as Bioshield T-9 on the threads. Chuck also likes to use nylon washers behind the chucks. This will facilitate chuck removal. Nylon washers are available from Craft Supplies.
4. **Do not use a scroll chuck's lever or key to seat the chuck to the headstock threads**  
Utilize the lathe's spindle lock along with the appropriate wrench/bar in the chuck's designated holes/flats to tighten the chuck to the headstock.
5. **Use beeswax on drill bit flutes to reduce friction and avoid overheating and squealing**
6. **Favorite drill bit for boring – Forrester Bit with saw tooth cutters – Available from Rocklers**
7. **To avoid breaking the screw in a screw chuck pre-drill to the minor diameter of the screw**
8. **Store finishing materials in a Rockler storage container with a funnel shaped top and when not in use spray Bloxgen (also available from Rockler) to preserve the finishing material.**
9. **For spindle turning make a scaled full size (not half) size drawing of the desired turning shape**
10. **For coloring wood black use Sumi Ink**
11. **Make your own flap sanders by purchasing mandrels available from Black&Decker and then cutting up nylon pads.**

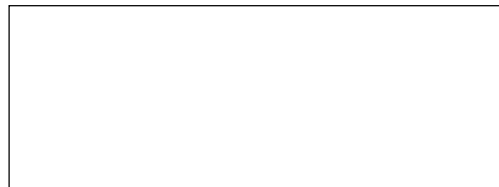
